MINISTER'S COLUMN, Scott Couper

Axial Tilt Is Not the Reason for the Season!

Happy New Year, Friends!

In the book of Galatians (4:4), Paul writes the phrase "when time had fully come" or another translation has it "when the fullness of time had come". Paul uses this phrase in reference to the Christmas season just past when "God sent his son...". Yet, the phrase is equally appropriate for us during the New Year season. So, let us at Centre Congregational Church reflect on 'time'.

Father Richard Rohr rightly reminds us that in the Greek language there are two kinds of time, *chronos* and *kairos*. *Chronos* is the normal time, from which we derive the word 'chronological'. *Chronos* is the New Year time when the clock ticks, the planner page turns, and our 2019 calendar already begins to fill-up! One of my close friends who is an atheist recently, and cynically, reminded me, 'Axial Tilt is the "Reason for the Season". Chronological time measured in seconds, minutes, hours, days and years according to the cosmos (Earth's orbit around the Sun, the Earth's rotation and, yes, the seasons governed by the Earth's tilted axis) is important, for it organizes our lives. However, chronological time does not provide our life meaning. There is a profound difference between providing organization (*chronos*) and providing meaning (*kairos*).

According to South African theologians, a *kairos* time is a 'special moment' or a 'God-given window of opportunity'. It is time infused with God, with spirit, with purpose, with intention and therefore with meaning!

When I look back on my life, now reaching middle age, the times I best remember are the times in which I felt. I felt 'this is special, this is unique, this is how I wish I could always feel'. Inevitably, when I feel this way, I am with others, with family, with friends, with my brothers and sisters in faith. In other words, I experience *kairos* moments in relationship with others. They are Godgiven moments for us to reach-out, just as "in the fullness of time" God reached-out to you and I in relationship through Jesus the Christ.

I have two neighbors, Tom and Eugene (one in his 80s and the other in his 100s!). Some of my best moments in Brattleboro are hearing these men's stories, sipping wine, and soaking-up their wisdom. There is no agenda. There is no itinerary. Just relationship.

I worship at Centre Congregational Church. Some of my best moments in Brattleboro have been being with all of you, worshiping, praying, singing, eating and laughing together – even in meetings where there is an agenda.

Friends, my message in this New Year to not let the *kairos* moments pass as the *chronos* moments inevitably do. When you encounter a *kairos* opportunity, grab hold of it, absorb it, experience it, ponder it in your heart, and treasurer it – just as Mary, mother of Jesus, did! I look forward to experiencing many *kairos* opportunities with you, at Centre Congregational Church, in 2019. This season, this year, I do not celebrate an axial tilt, but rather the spirit of God enabling us to love, affirm and establish peace.

"...Paneurythmy was developed in the early 1900s by Bulgarian spiritual mystic, Beniso Douno. I began dancing with Rupa Cousins 15 years ago, as she led the dance each Sunday morning until her passing. The entire dance consists of 28 gestures... with *The Sunrise* considered the spiritual height of the dance. This dance/gesture honors both the outer sun and our inner sun as a life giving and sustaining force.

I feel this time of year is a wonderful time to offer this dance/gesture. With the darkness of winter and the lessening of the sun's rays, when all of nature draws inward, this is when we can become aware of and develop our inner sun, our inner light to warm ourselves and others." BOARD/COMMITTEE 2019 CALENDAR PLANNING MEETING

Dear Friends in Christ:

On Saturday, 12 January 2019, Buildings & Grounds will sponsor a breakfast and 'Spatial Envisioning Workshop' from 9-11am in which we will seek to make better and more efficient use of our church building. We desire to ensure that the church and all the ministries it supports are able to operate optimally. We pray that in Christian fellowship we will discern the best means by which Loaves & Fishes, Carry Me Home, Brattleboro Centre for Children, Centre Congregational Church (Minister, Administrator, Fundraising Committee, Music Committee, Deacons, etc...), Alcoholics Anonymous, counselling tenants upstairs, and Groundworks Collaborative (possible future food shelf) can all utilize the space availed to us for the betterment of our faith and wider community.

Following the workshop, the staff and church leadership will hold from 1-4:30pm in the library 15 minute sessions with representatives from each of the various ministries in our church so as to begin to create a 'master calendar' for the 2019 year. With this calendar, we will be able to better manage our time and prevent double-bookings for rentals of our space. All ministries (Finance, Council, Deacons, Mission and Service, Music, Fundraising, etc....) of the church are to send a representative at the time allotted (schedule posted below and on the library door) to submit an EXAUSTIVE and COMPRE-HENSIVE (regular meetings and events) schedule plan of their ministry for the year. If no representative is able to make the time allocated to the ministry and if all other times thereafter suggested are not feasible, then a written itemization outlining the entire year's schedule can be submitted. The master calendar will be available to the public and can be changed and viewed in real time. So, we hope that with this initiative, all will be better informed and will therefore be able to participate in the life-giving opportunities our church has to offer.


