Some time ago, our dear and faithful Barbara St. John forwarded to me poetry written by Allen that I would like to share with you again (*Borrowed Life and Other Poems*, Brattleboro, Vermont, 2012).

The Cup of Love

At times the cup of life is filled right up. Yet comes there times when that cup we thought would yet be full is emptied out. Plans are unmade, set upon the shelf, for what was to be is not now to be. Pain that throbs and fades and throbs again resides where hope once was, and as it falters emptiness remains.

Love fills the void.
Love endures when all else drains away, holds fast when others holds are lost.
Hope may dim, but love is sure and cannot be denied.
Some gifts are given, then withdrawn, but such is love that where it lives

hope once again can find a place, and both together make all new.

As I reflect on Allen's wisdom, I recall the tragedy of Jesus' crucifixion and the disillusionment of the disciples. Yet, we experienced last month on Easter Day the resurrection followed. I recall my own recent divorce. Yet, I pray a life-long relationship awaits. I mourn the loss of Pat Austin (who we remembered on March 22), Gisela Robeck (who we will remember on May 7), Dee Keller (who we will remember on June 22), and The Rev Dr Allen Vander Meulen II (who we will remember on June 25). Yet, we celebrate the arrival of new members (Lee and Carolyn, Tom and Caitlin, John and Beth) and the fellowship of new friends (Gabi and Teddy, Jackie, Martha, Daniel, AJ, Matthew, Mark, Andrew, and Isaac). Some beloved ministries conclude while others are gifted to us unexpectedly (Afghan resettlement co-sponsorship efforts and the 'Green at Centre').

I thank God that I belong to a community of faith wherein I can experience the losses and pain of life and gains and celebrations of life. The ties that hold our community fast together is Love. Love draws us to God. Love draws us to one another. Love conquers loss and pain. Love fosters new blessings and opportunities.

During the post-Resurrection season of Easter, we will learn more about our Christian faith with a sermon series entitled "Christian Symbols: Signposts of Devotion" and a sermon series on comparative religion entitled "Christianity and Islam: Siblings in Faith". My prayer is that all that we hear, all that we study, all that we sing, all that we pray, and all who we serve will bring us closer to God and closer to one another in love.

May is only three months after February (when our meeting was held) but we will be reviewing our situation at this time, in hopes of avoiding a separate meeting later. The pleasure of your company is not just requested, it is required. Well, not really, but we do need to have a quorum.


