MINISTER'S COLUMN, Scott Couper

This year's Advent sermon series entitled "**Tear Open the Heavens**" will be taken from the prophet Isaiah's imperative: "If only you would tear open the heaven's and come down!" (Isaiah 64:1).

When simply silently reading Isaiah, this verse may be easy to overlook. Yet when the prophet's words are read dramatically out loud, the verse is stunning! Isaiah is quite provocative, to say the least. Not just to our ears! But I am sure also to God's – for Isaiah is indeed deliberately trying to *provoke* God into taking some kind of action.

For Advent to be Advent, we too must be provocative. We, like Isaiah need to wait so hard and for so long that it almost hurts. And who among us is already there? I know so many who are agonizing over the news of our brother Samuel Rodriguez in Apopa, El Salvador, a parishioner of our sister church at Las Cabanitas. He has been picked-up in the dragnet, 80,000 in prison, 8,000-10,000 innocent, 200 have died, mostly poor families suffer, implemented by the government's suspension of *habeas corpus* for suspected gang members. It seems that even in the rush to justice there exists injustice!

Likewise in the Holy Land, the place of peace to which we look for love and faithfulness to God, injustice reigns with the killing of thousands of innocent Palestinians in the quest to inflict justice upon the brutal murders perpetrated by Hamas.

Closer to home, we have actually heard argued in front of the Supreme Court the bizarre case of a domestic abuser who advocates that he has a seemingly sacrosanct Second Amendment right to own and use assault rifles when our country suffers a never-ending litany of mass shootings. It is almost unbearable!

This Advent we also impertinently cry out to God, "If only you would tear open the heaven and come down!" In other words, "God, will you finally DO SOMETHING?!"

And yet, God did, God is, and God will continue to do something.

Jesus, Emmanuel, 'God with Us' walked our Earth and shared with us the words, the mind, the heart, the actions, and the wisdom of God. Through the Holy Spirit, the Christ that was Jesus, dwells within us today so that we demonstrate the words, mind, heart, actions, and wisdom of God. And God will, as Jesus prayed, with us, someday, establish the realm of God on Earth just as it is established in heaven.

This Advent season, please do not miss a worship service. Wait with me until it hurts, if it already does not hurt too much already. Anticipate with the leaders of our church the coming of the Christ in Jesus. With families in our church, let us remind ourselves of Hope, Love, Joy, and Peace – all leading to the day of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem when we worship around the light of the Christ candle on Christmas Eve.

DEACONS ADVENT WREATH

In 1839 a Lutheran minister in Germany created a wreath out of the wheel of a cart with twenty small red candles and four large white candles. The red ones were lit on weekdays and the white ones on Sundays during Advent.

Evergreens were eventually added as a symbol of everlasting life in the midst of winter and death. The circle represents God's unending love and eternal life.

Red berries are used as a reminder of Jesus' sacrifice and death; pinecones signify new life.

The candles we use on our Advent Wreath atop the beautiful wrought iron stand are lit by church families along with a meaningful liturgy on the four Sundays of Advent and Christmas Eve.

December 3 - Purple/Hope

December 10 - Purple/Love

December 17 - Pink/Joy

December 24 - Purple/Peace

December 24 - White/Christ


In December, there will be other ways to give and support others:

- And of course, cash donations


How to donate to Loaves & Fishes?
