for the hour of new clarity.—Rainer Maria Rilke


The future must enter you long before it happens. Here is a phrase that speaks powerfully to transitional times in churches. Visually, it portrays the future being present in the here and now, as opposed to being "out there" somewhere waiting to be reached or arrived at – a mere object of our imaginations. The future is intimately bound up with our present, and is being formed by who we are and what we do – and, hopefully, by what God is calling us to be. The future must pass through the filters of human language, thought, and experience in order to be birthed into existence. In Christian practice, it must also pass through prayer and reflection. Human being is everywhere an agent of God's creative activity.

I look at Centre Congregational Church and I see a church still trying to find its way into a future that is yet unclear. I see a congregation that is still waiting to give birth to its images, still trying to discover what those images are, still searching for the hour of new clarity. The labor is long, the birthing is difficult, and the

journey is definitely not for the faint of heart. The future can be a reluctant guest, an elusive image, or a disruptive intruder – but the past is no longer an attainable destination and the present is continually morphing into both past and future, like a river that is ever flowing and changing.



The challenge for churches in transition is to not fear the unsettling strangeness of this moment. The movement of change can be daunting and disorienting, but it is also inevitable, energizing, and laden with potential. Embracing change and living into new moments of possibility are the keys to growth and vitality.

Your future is not out there somewhere; it is here waiting to be born. Let it enter you. Welcome it. Learn to be midwives. The hour of new clarity will be birthed in due time, in God's time.

Yes, you read that right!

Long-time members may remember when our Special Offering of the Month was called the Second Sunday Offering, and Mission & Service has decided to return to that format for our Special Offerings. The month-long offering was a well-intentioned idea, but it has had a few drawbacks: It somehow diluted the offering, making it less "special;" it has been shortchanging the General Fund, which used to receive the other weeks' offerings; and it sometimes makes it harder to give by requiring writing on envelopes and checks every time.

So here's how it works:



On the Second Sunday of the month, all loose and non-pledge offerings will go to the Second Sunday Offering recipient. Check or cash, it doesn't matter, special envelopes optional. We're going to try to make it more Special. Brochures (and yes, sometimes special envelopes) will be available. When possible, speakers will be arranged to tell us about their organizations.

On the other Sundays, if you missed or forgot the Second Sunday and still wish to give, you are welcome to; just make sure it is clearly designated on your check memo line or in an envelope of cash. Otherwise, all loose and non-pledge offerings on those weeks will go into the General Fund for Centre Church.


